Patient and family advisors provide a voice that represents all patients and families of patients who receive care at Rooks County Health Center (RCH). They partner with hospital staff to help improve the quality of RCH's care for all patients and family members.

What is an RCH Patient & Family Advisor?

A patient and family advisor is someone who:

- Wants to help improve the quality of our hospital's care for all patients and family members.
- Gives feedback to RCH based on his or her own experiences as a patient or family member.
- Helps RCH plan changes to improve care of patients.
- Works with RCH for either short or long-term commitments, depending on the project.
- Volunteers his or her time (usually at least one hour and not more than four hours per month).

Why should you become an RCH Patient & Family Advisor?

- When you or your family member was in the hospital, did you think there were things that could have been better?
- Do you have ideas on how to make sure other patients and families get the best care possible? Patient and family advisors give RCH feedback and ideas from the patient's perspective to help improve the quality of care provided.

Who can be an RCH Patient & Family Advisor?

No special qualifications are required to become an advisor. You can be an advisor if you, or a family member, received care at RCH in the last five years. What's most important is your experience as a patient or family member. RCH will provide you with any other training you may need.

What does an RCH Patient & Family Advisor do?

As one of RCH's Patient and Family Advisors, you can help in the following ways:

- Share your story. Advisors help by talking about their health care experiences with clinicians, staff and other patients.
- Serve on RCH's Patient and Family Advisory Council. The advisory council meets regularly to discuss and plan improvements for hospital quality. Members include patients, family members and hospital staff.
- Work on short-term projects, for example helping to plan and design a family resource room.

Is being an RCH Patient & Family Advisor right for you?

Being an RCH Patient & Family Advisor may be a good match with your skills and experiences if you can:

- Speak up and share suggestions and potential solutions to help improve hospital care for all.
- Share your experiences as a patient or family member being mindful and forward thinking beyond your own personal experiences.
- Talk about both positive and negative care experiences, sharing your thoughts on what went well and how things could have been handled differently.
- Work with people who may be different than you.
- Listen to and think about what others say, even when you disagree.
- Bring a positive attitude to discussions.
- Keep any information you may hear as an advisor private and confidential.

RCH Departments and Stockton EMS Ace State Inspections

Over the past few months, various departments at Rooks County Health Center (RCH) as well as the Stockton Emergency Medical Service underwent inspections by state agencies. All were found to be in complete compliance with zero deficiencies found in the inspections.



“The number of agencies that have been out to survey us in the last couple months that have noted zero deficiencies for RCH Pharmacy, Lab, Radiology and the Stockton EMS testifies to the fact that we are constantly striving to achieve these results in Rooks county,” said Pam Harmon, RCH Chief Nursing Officer.

RCH’s laboratory department underwent an inspection by The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) in December 2015. RCH’s CLIA (Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments) certified laboratory has a state inspection every two years. The thorough review of every aspect of the laboratory found everything to be in compliance.

In March, the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy, which also develops the regulations and requirements, surveyed the pharmacy at RCH. Lisa Karlin, Director of Pharmacy at RCH, reports that her department also passed the inspection with flying colors.

The RCH Radiology Department went through state inspections in April. The inspections involved examining specific policies, procedures, quality control paperwork, tracking radiation doses, Radiologists’ reports, etc.

“The state inspects mammography every year, and this is the fourth year in a row that RCH has not had any deficiencies. The ACR sets the standards for mammography and the state does the inspection. The Radiology department as a whole, excluding mammography, is inspected by the state every three years. The state also sets the standards. This year, we came away again without any deficiencies,” said Karen Harris, Director of Radiology at RCH. The Stockton Emergency Medical Services (EMS) also received a Zero Deficiency score for the ambulance service in an inspection performed by a compliance officer for the Kansas Board of EMS in February. The annual inspection covers operations and medical protocols, response records, staff certifications as well as equipment inspections. On the inspection sheet, the compliance officer noted that the service was well organized, compliant and complimented the staff on the excellent job they were doing.

“I have a dedicated staff. It is their dedication and hard work that needs to be recognized. Because of their professionalism and highly trained skills, we are able to provide excellent service and patient care to our communities. As a group effort, we have received a non-deficiency inspection for yet another year,” said Julie Cole, Director of the Stockton EMS.


