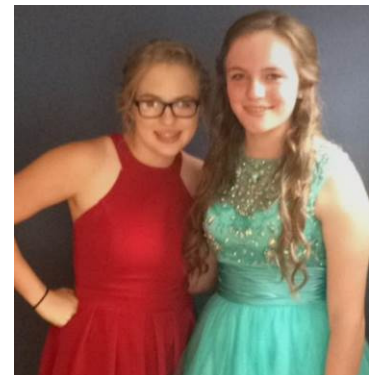

RCHF INTRODUCES “DUCK DIVE” AT PARADISE CREEK FESTIVAL

On June 10, 500 ducks will fly, and then dive, for a great cause. In an effort to raise funds for the Rooks County Healthcare Foundation (RCHF) 500 plastic numbered ducks will be launched into the Plainville city pool during the Paradise Creek Festival and then race towards the “finish line”. Tickets are being sold and the lucky buyers whose numbered duck “wins” will receive cash prizes.

The event takes the place of the previous RCHF annual fund raiser known as the Golf Ball Drop. Low attendance at the previous event plus a desire by the Foundation to add novelty and excitement to the fundraiser were cited as reasons for the change.

Each duck is numbered and tickets are sold for each corresponding number. The winning ducks are those that reach the goal first or are closest to the goal. 1st prize ticket holders receive 10% of the total profits, 2nd prize 5% and 3rd prize 3%. There is also a \$100 “wild duck” prize for the duck that lands in the most unusual place as determined by the judges.

The event takes place at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 10 at the Plainville city pool during the Paradise Creek Festival.

The exact details of how the ducks will be launched appear to be a closely guarded secret, however rumors have been circulating about the building of a mysterious “duck cannon” and the participation of “a jolly old elf”.

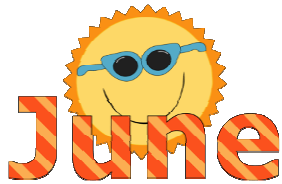
